A-JCHS District 81 Parents and Guardians,

Last night, the Anna-Jonesboro Community High School Board of Education held its regular board meeting for the month of October. After careful deliberation, the board approved the following adjustments to the district's current learning plan, beginning Wednesday November 4, 2020.

Option 1:

Blended Learning with In-Person Instruction for ALL students Tuesday-Friday. Mondays will continue to be Remote Instruction Days for all students.

The current In-Person schedule will remain in place. On Tuesdays-Fridays, students will be in class from 8:08—1:16, with staggered dismissal through 1:25.

Students should try to arrive after 7:50 a.m. and report directly to class. Those who must arrive prior to 7:50 will continue to report to the cafeteria/lower gym area.

All safety guidelines, including the use of face coverings at all times, will remain in place, with the exception of strict 6-foot social distancing. While 6-foot social distancing will continue to be the aim, there will be locations where students' social distancing of six feet or more will not be possible.

Option 2:

100% Remote Instruction. Families who choose this option will be committing to this learning plan for the remainder of Semester 1, which ends December 18, 2020.

If your child or children will be choosing a different learning plan than the one they are currently on, please contact the office by Wednesday October 28th. If your child or children will be staying with their current learning plan, you do not need to contact the school.

All in-person students should come to school on Wednesday, November 4th.

This adjustment to our current plan was made after much discussion during the open session at last night's board meeting. The discussion included a review of the recent Learning Format Survey results, Faculty and Staff Survey results, current academic data, current district COVID data, and community feedback. We recognize the scheduling demands that this current school year have had on all families as well as the increased academic supports required from home. We appreciate all that you have done and continue to do!
