[^0]:    Items from Student Council: Hi, I'm Katie Sullivan, the Homecoming Coordinator for Student Council. Student Council has been incredibly busy over the past few weeks working on homecoming. Last Friday, AJCHS celebrated its homecoming with several different events. To begin, each class competed in decorating hallways and windows the week before homecoming. On the Friday of homecoming, they competed in a series of games at a pep rally. After the pep rally, everyone met downtown for the homecoming parade. There were a total of 83 entries in the parade. We had 5 bands compete. During halftime of the homecoming football game, Student Council held the coronation for the Homecoming King and Queen. This year's king is Jason McAllister and this year's queen is Alayna Menees. Student Council's most significant project of the year is the homecoming dance. They spend months planning the decorations and weeks to execute the design. This year's theme was "Beneath the Blue". Our under-the-sea dance contained many different themed sections to help people feel transported beneath the ocean. Jellyfish Land had several light-up jellyfish hanging from the trees that appeared to float as if they were in water. Mermaid Land had a live mermaid that people could go take pictures with.
